

## My Favorite Recipe

This **Mexican Chicken Casserole** is one of my favorite recipes. I received it from my friend, Shari Walker, over 40 years ago.

It is great for Thanksgiving leftovers or potlucks and always gets raves! Enjoy!

### MEXICAN CHICKEN CASSEROLE

½+ pkg. Doritos  
 1 onion, chopped & browned  
 1 can Cream of Mushroom soup  
 1 can Cream of Chicken soup  
 1 cup sour cream  
 4 oz. can sliced ripe olives  
 4 oz. can diced green chiles  
 4 cups chicken or turkey (3 breasts) cubed & cooked  
 ½ tsp. garlic salt  
 ½ tsp. pepper  
 ¾ lb. Colby Jack cheese (or whichever you prefer)

#### DIRECTIONS

Combine onion, soups, sour cream, green chiles, garlic salt, and pepper. Stir until well blended.

In a well-greased 10 or 12 inch Dutch oven, layer Doritos (coarsely crumbled), chicken, soup mixture, olives and cheese. Repeat layers.

Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.

(Briquettes: 10" oven – 14 top/7 bottom; 12" oven – 17 top/8 bottom.)



## Cal Poly Introduction to Bishop Mule Days Competition

On March 4th at 9 a.m. Cal Poly San Luis Obispo sponsored a hands-on training for intercollegiate students. There were over 30 students, plus their coaches, who made the journey to San Luis. Our attendees were: Cheyenne Mason, Tyler Sherman and Jasmine Garrett. Coaches Doug Dollarhide, Dave Rumsey and myself were the chaperones. After registration, Rick Jacobsen demonstrated how to pack a mule and tie the box hitch. Jerry Jones, the official judge from Bishop Mule days, explained all the rules of Mule Days. They had five iron mules set up so the students could take turns throwing hitches and learning from one another. There were two individual hitch competitions: the diamond and the box hitch. All of the students were timed and the times were placed on a table for the students to look at their times and everyone else's times also. That way they could compare how they did. This was an educational competition and no awards were given.

Lunch was provided by the Bishop Mule Days Committee. There were no costs involved but gas and time. John Ready and Dave Rumsey cooked hot dogs and hamburgers. All the condiments were also displayed with chips and cookies. We thank John and Dave for all their fine efforts and a great lunch.

After lunch the fun began with the team competition. They only had three live mules that could take the pressure of a bunch of crazy kids throwing ropes and running around them! The speed was on and many mistakes were made. ## Spring Reminders

Spring has arrived - at least according to the horses. With hair blowing everywhere, it is time to take a moment, assess our horses and prepare for the season to come.

If your horse has insect bite hypersensitivity or seasonal allergies, start them on their omega-3 fatty acid supplements to help keep their immune system calm. Do you have your fly sheet, fly mask, and fly boots for the year? If your horse will need medications, such as anti-histamines or steroids to get them through allergy season, make sure your veterinarian has seen the horse this year and is aware of their needs so prescriptions can be filled before it becomes an urgent need.

As shedding season progresses, pay special attention. How is your horse shedding out? Are they taking longer than usual? Are they keeping guard hairs on their legs and bellies? Now is a good time to have your horse tested for Equine Cushings/PPID if they are not shedding normally.

Has your horse gained or lost weight over the winter? Those shaggy coats and blankets can hide a lot. Make needed adjustments to your feeding program now so your horse is in good shape for the riding season. If your horse is struggling to keep weight on, a dental and fecal exam should be considered.

A group (Ace 4 Safe Trails) has been sending letters expressing their concern with State Parks' plan to implement "multi-use trails." This plan combines all fast moving and slow moving trail users on the same single track trails. This would be dangerous and it would ruin the enjoyable experience in nature all trail users seek. Instead of creating stressful, unsafe multi-use trails, Ace 4 Safe Trails has been urging State Parks to provide separate high speed and low speed trails which would be far safer and more enjoyable for park visitors.


